Minimum Graduation Credits: 128 credits

Special Course Requirements:

Minimum graduation credits: 128 credits, including the following three categories:

1. University-wide required courses: 32 credits, including 28 credits of general education courses and 4 credits of physical education. Students must complete these courses in accordance with university regulations. Please note the minimum and maximum credit requirements for each category of general education courses. General education credits taken beyond the required amount will not be counted toward graduation credits.
2. Department required professional courses: 57 credits. Students must complete the required professional courses listed above in this department. Without approval from the department office, courses with the same titles offered by other departments may not be used as substitutes. For one-semester required courses, if a student takes a year-long course with the same title offered by another department and the credits for the first semester exceed the credit limit specified in this table, only the credits specified in this table will be counted. Credits from the second semester of that course may be counted as departmental elective credits.
3. Elective credits: 39 credits, including departmental professional electives (course codes beginning with 206), electives from other departments or universities, programs, minors, and double majors. Courses taken at other universities may be counted toward graduation credits only with departmental approval. Elective courses in All-out Defense Education Military Training and Physical Education will not be counted toward graduation credits.
